On November 21, 2019, Lotte Duty Free held a ceremony for the donation at the Health and Multicultural Family Support Center in Incheon. Lotte stated in a press release that starting in December this year, the homes of 10 single mothers in Incheon will be cleaned and repainted to create a more pleasant living environment. Furniture and storage equipment will also be provided for their children's study rooms.

Additionally, a history tour programme will be conducted for 240 multicultural families with children, as well as North Korean defectors. The programme will give the beneficiaries a chance to experience and understand Korean history and culture accurately so that they can adapt to life in South Korea. Lotte Duty Free will conduct six of such tours, starting from December 14, 2019.

Commenting on this donation, Kim Jung-hyun, head of Lotte Duty Free's marketing division said: "This donation is more meaningful as it is used to improve the housing environment and social adaptations of vulnerable people in Incheon."
